The records we keep enable us to plan for your care.

Risk stratification for case finding' is a process for identifying and managing patients who have or may be at risk of health conditions (such as diabetes) or who are most likely to need healthcare services (such as people with frailty).

Risk stratification tools used in the NHS help determine a person's risk of suffering a particular condition and enable us to focus on preventing ill health before it develops.

Information about you is collected from a number of sources including NHS Trusts, GP Federations and your GP Practice. A risk score is then arrived at through an analysis of your de-identified information. This can help us identify and offer you additional services to improve your health.

This practice keeps data on you that we apply searches and algorithms to in order to identify from preventive interventions. This means using only the data we hold or in certain circumstances linking that data to data held elsewhere by other organisations, and usually processed by organisations within or bound by contracts with the NHS.

Despite this we have an overriding responsibility to do what is in your best interests. If we identify you as being at significant risk of having, for example a heart attack or stroke, we are justified in performing that processing in order to provide you with medical care.
