Healthy Tips

Extra Appointments at GP Extra



We also offer the facility for patients to book a doctor's appointment at the Beeches Medical Centre for our patients to be seen by other doctors at the HCRC in Widnes town centre. The facility is known as 'GP Extra'. Patients can be seen from 6:30pm - 9:00pm, Monday to Friday and at weekends from 9:30am - 3:30pm.

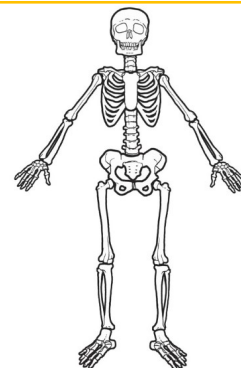
The facility is useful for people who can not get an appointment on the day at their own surgery or for people who work during the day.

New Self-referral for Musculoskeletal Pain/Physiotherapy

Patients can now self-refer for musculoskeletal pain without seeing their GP by **contacting 0151 495 5472.**

Patients will receive a 10 minute telephone appointment slot initially to talk about their symptoms. The physiotherapy practitioner can then give the best options on the way forward.

Patients can also self refer for podiatry services, please ask for a form at reception.



A New Way of Referring Patients for Treatment

PLEASE ENSURE WE HAVE YOUR CORRECT CONTACT NUMBER

If your doctor refers you for treatment, a referral letter will be sent electronically to the Central Lancashire Integrated Referral Gateway. A specialist clinician will then clinically assess the referral and then send to the appropriate department. Within 24 hours a referral will reach the booking stage and patients will be contacted by phone or text (with consent), so please ensure that we have your updated contact details.
