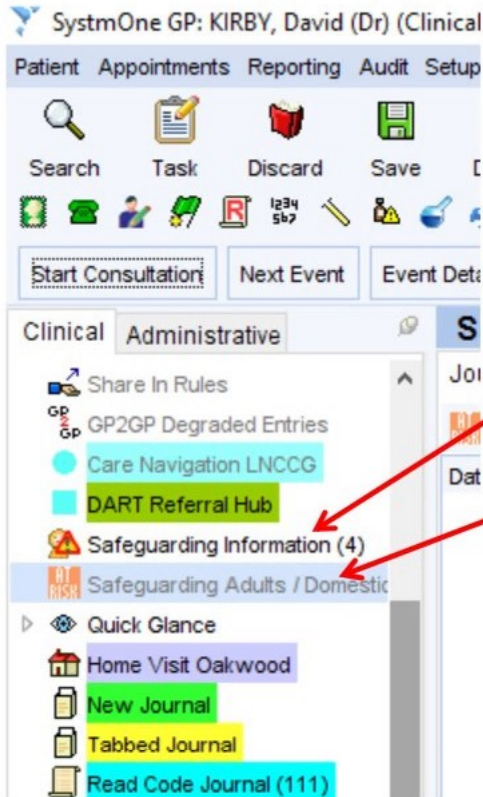


Safeguarding information within clinical systems

SystemOne:

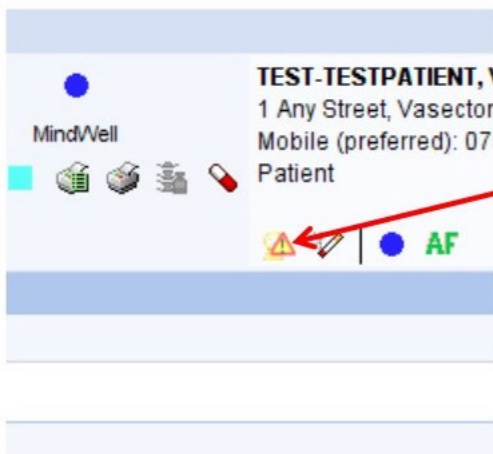
Individual GP surgeries use the clinical tree within SystemOne slightly differently. The order of the features changes, but each surgery should have some standard Safeguarding nodes. Clicking on these allows you to read important Safeguarding information in addition to adding your own (whilst also following the normal Safeguarding processes/referrals etc as outlined in the Safeguarding Policy available in the Document Library).

If no information is recorded within the node, it is 'greyed' out.



Safeguarding information can be found by clicking on the Safeguarding node.

'Greyed' out, indicating no information within



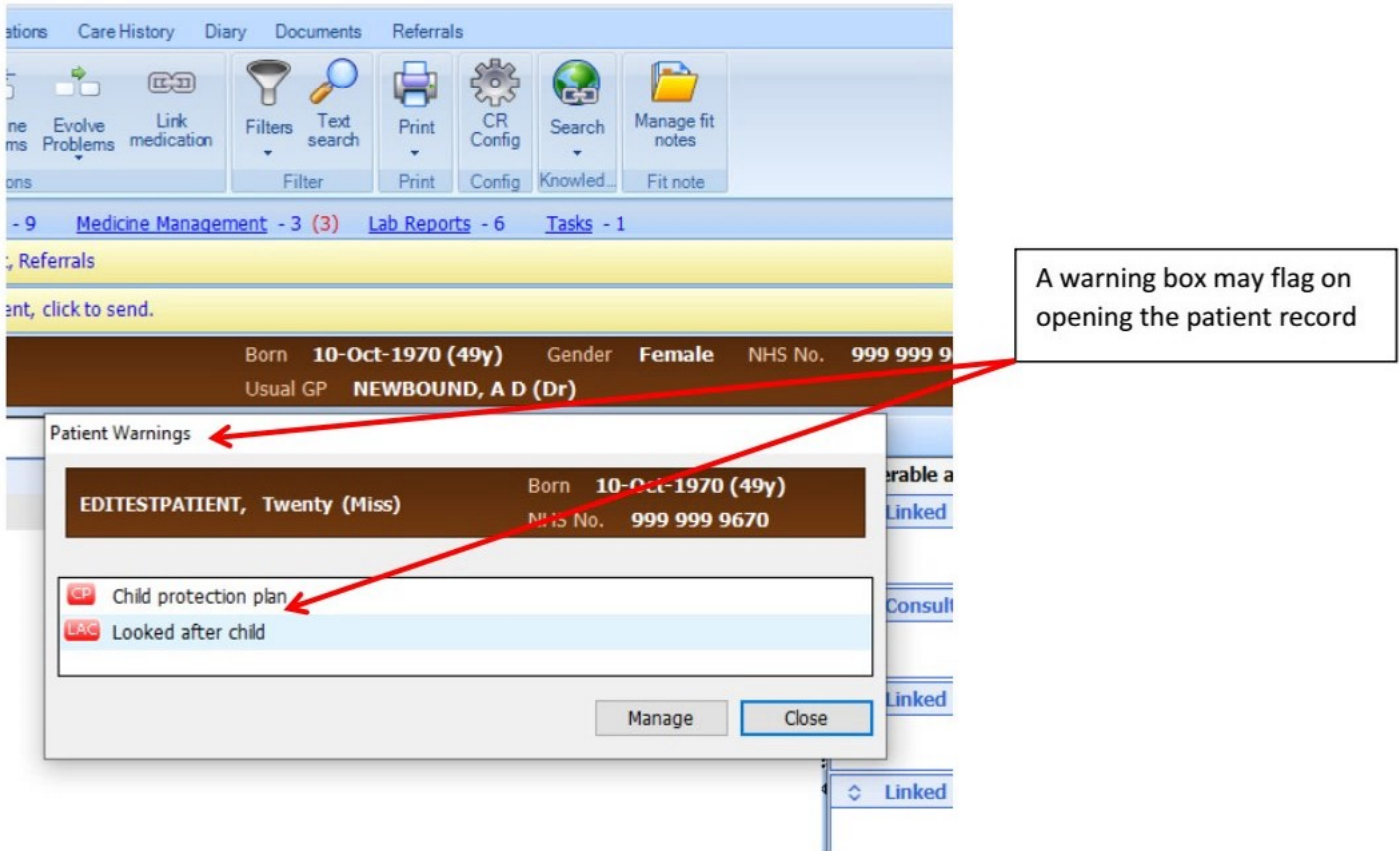
An icon may also be present under the demographic box indicating previous/current safeguarding information

EMIS:

EMIS does not use the same Safeguarding nodes as SystemOne. There are templates available that can be searched for to input Safeguarding data.

Via these templates and other Safeguarding codes, EMIS automatically adds Safeguarding information for ease of visibility.

(please note the demographic box on the screenshots below are brown as it is a 'test patient'; ordinarily this box is blue).



If the patient is on a Child Protection Plan or is a Looked After Child, a 'CP' or 'LAC' flag is present within the blue demographic box within EMIS (brown in this example as a 'test patient').
