Outside of surgery hours, if you have an urgent but non lifethreatening medical need, please use the NHS 111 website first https://111.nhs.uk/ or call 111 rather than going straight to A&E.

You should dial 999 ONLY if you have a life-threatening illness or injury.

- Invitations will be going out mostly by text/NHS App messaging towards the end of August with a self-book link. Letters will be sent to those eligible patients that we do not have mobile numbers.
- We will be vaccinating our Housebound patients and will contact you to arrange.

Eligible patients are:

- those aged 65 years and over
- those aged 6 months to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
- pregnant women
- all children aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2023
- primary school aged children (from Reception to Year 6)
- those in long-stay residential care homes
- carers in receipt of carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person
- close contacts of immunocompromised individuals

Primary Care Network

BromleyConnect Primary Care Network News

The London Lane Clinic is part of the Bromley Connect Primary Care Network, along with the Dysart Surgery and the South View Partnership.

Bromley Connect PCN serves approximately 42,000 patients in central Bromley.

Working together as a PCN allows us to pool resources, share expertise and provide our patients with a number of services and staff who assist the General Practitioners and Practice Nurses in each practice in providing direct patient clinical and non-clinical care.

Roles include: First Contact - Physiotherapists, Clinical Pharmacists, Care Coordinators, Social Prescribing Link Workers, Mental Health Practitioners, Pharmacy Technicians

What is a Clinical Pharmacist and a Pharmacy Technician?

- Clinical Pharmacists provide specialist expertise in the use of medicines, helping to address both the public health and social care needs of patients within a PCN
- They help tackle inequalities by helping to improve access to care
- They undertake structured medication reviews (SMRs) to proactively manage people with complex polypharmacy
- They work closely with other members of the multi-disclipinary team in ensuring that patients with chronic diseases get the maximum benefits from their medicines as part of a shared decision-making consultation.
- **Pharmacy Technicians** play an important role within general practice and complement the more clinical work of the clinical pharmacist, through utilisation of their technical skill
- They undertake patient facing and patient supporting roles to ensure effective medicines use, through shared decision-making conversations with patients.
- They carry out medicines optimisation tasks including effective medicine administration, supporting medication reviews and medicines reconciliation.

PCN Clinical Pharmacy Team working with local community pharmacies

- A meeting between the PCN Pharmacy team and the local community pharmacies was held to discuss mutual issues
- Duncans Chemist, Day Lewis pharmacy, Scotts pharmacy and Rowlands pharmacy attended
- discussed stock issues and service commissioning from primary care to community through CPCS GP referrals to unload part of the workload
- discussed ways to arrange an easier way for the community to contact primary care in case of urgent requests or referrals.
- Gave a better understanding of services provided by the community pharmacy which could benefit both sectors (e.g. Hypertension case findings).
